HIGHLIGHTS OF LSF ACCOMPLISHMENTS CY 2014

The Lupon School of Fisheries completed another page of its history as the year 2014 ended with many accomplished activities in the fulfillment of the institutional as well as national goals in developing the youth.

Guided with the principle of empowering the students with the skills, improving their knowledge, and developing the right attitude towards work, LSF continued to find ways to implement meaningful activities that improve their quality of life. The school adhered to the truth that developing the students does not stop in the four corners of the classrooms and workstations. It is borderless. The students undertook activities for lifelong learning beyond the usual workstations.

One of these lifelong learning activities was conceived out of the need to combat hunger and malnutrition in the lower level when Miss Ruth R. Pundang, Vocational School Administrator III conceptualized raising vegetables applying the technology of container gardening in risers. The main objective was to inculcate among the students their contribution to the food production in the community. The project gave the students the idea that it is not impos-

sible to produce vegetables in small spaces with the aid of risers and the application of the appropriate soil media preparation. The administrator gained the support of the lead trainers, who supervised the students in raising vegetables in risers.

The greening of the campus brightened the surroundings which also added attraction during the 31st Founding Anniversary celebration of the school. The PBB Big Winner and ABS-CBN's "Agri Tayo Dito" host, Mr. Ruben Gonzaga, surprised the LSF teaching and non-teaching personnel as well as the students when he came to see the project upon the invitation of Mr. Armando Angsinco, Chairman, Provincial Agri-Fishery Council. Mr. Gonzaga expressed his amazement with the aesthetic arrangement and the resourcefulness of the lead trainers and students in using the recyclable containers. Mr. Angsinco commended the concerted efforts of the LSF personnel in launching the project and encouraged them to pursue it and make the people in the community learn and gain profits out of it.

LSF ended the year with so much to thank for having performed meaningful accomplishments.

LSF Hosts PAAKA

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

- Despite the status quo of 2014 budget on Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE), Lupon School of Fisheries' targets increased by 30% particularly in the number of Enrolled, Graduates, Assessed, Certified and Employed (EGACE). The finance department has given its full

support in the achievement of its targets. Included in this achievement are the improvements made namely: finalization of Driving lecture room, refurbishment of storage and supply office, as well as the installation of Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) with 2 monitoring center and eight cameras situated in different strategic places within the main campus. With this enhancement in place, the school has strengthened its internal control system. LSF has also enhance the Animal Production NC II lecture room at the fishpond/agri area.
