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The year that was: A year of many firsts

The 47th founding anniversary of Lupon School of Fisheries was a celebration of and thanksgiving for the many blessings the School had received for the year 2016. For one, the School were among a few, if not the only one nationwide, to have at least thirteen course offerings qualified for the TVET Program Star Rating System. After the audit of TVET experts in region XI led by PD Arlyn Bandong of Comval, eleven qualifications were given one star ratings and two qualifications including LSF's distinctive area of competence, Aquaculture

NC II, were awarded with two stars. Also, the year 2016 saw a good number of trainers who were conferred with graduate degrees in vocational education (MVE) through a monumental scholarship program, the first in the School's 47 years of existence where 13 faculty members simultaneously earned their masters degrees and the appurtenances thereof especially the eleven new project-based researches. To top it all is Lupon School of Fisheries' distinctive award being the Philippines' first ever recipient of the most coveted Gold Level accreditation status by the Asia Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC) given on August 30, 2016. The APACC Gold Award was a game-changer of some sort as the TVET community in the Philippines particularly the Public TESDA Institutions (TTIs) are scrambling to get another nod from APACC with pressure on the side.

With these many Firsts, it is but fitting to celebrate the 47th founding anniversary with cheers and smiles. The three-day celebration took off with the Dawn Prayer and Thanksgiving Mass followed by a motorcade around town, a mini skills competition and a blood letting activity. On the second day a thanksgiving program was held with guests and visitors from TESDA, led by the Assistant Regional Director and Provincial Director of Davao del Norte Remegias Timonio, Ph.D., the people from the academe, former employees and colleagues, successful Alumni and the Honorable Joel Mayo Almario. A splendiferous lunch for everybody followed suit after the Program with palarong pinoy in the afternoon. The celebration ended with the Lupon Municipal High School – Lupon School of Fisheries high school and post-secondary alumni homecoming on the third day which is an annual event to foster closeness and friendships among graduates and the extended family of the School.
