LSF trainers attend life skills training

From August 14 to 18, 2017 a training on life skills was held at the Grand Regal Hotel in Lanang, Davao City.

The five-day trainers training on life skills was designed and intended for TESDA XI trainers and instructors from the four public TESDA Technology Institutions (TTIs) in Davao Region – Carmelo C. De Los

Cientos National Trade School, Wangan National Agricultural School, Davao National Agricultural School and Lupon School of Fisheries – and the Regional Training Center Davao (KORPHIL) and Provincial Training Center Mintal.

The training was commissioned by TESDA XI and conducted by the MyDev staff under the auspices of the USAID headed by Ms. Nancy Wallace, chief of party and Ms. Miriam Pahm, deputy chief of party.

During the course of the training, there were six modules discussed to wit; Personal Development, Interpersonal Communication, Leadership & Teamwork, Work Habits & Conduct, Safety & Health at Work, Rights & Re-

sponsibilities of Workers and Employers, Financial Fitness, Exploring Entrepreneurship and Civic Engagement.

More new fangled ways to discuss the modules were undertaken through plenary sessions, break-out sessions, games and ice breakers.

TESDA XI top honcho, Dr. Gaspar S. Gayona, had his parting words to the participants during the closing ceremony and reiterated the importance of life skills hence its impending integration during regular trainings by the TTIs and Training Centers at least in Davao Region.

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The said workshop was organized by the South East Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO) in collaboration with ASEAN-China Centre and Chinese Government during the 10th China-ASEAN Education Cooperation Week. Its objective is to strengthen collaboration, and prepare commitments and agreed action plans among TVET institutions in China and Southeast Asia.

The 4-day event was full of VIP's and notable speakers including Dr. Gatot Hari Priowirjanto, Director, SEAMO Secretariat; Mme. Yang Xiuping, Secretary-General, ASEAN-China Centre; Mr. Lu Yuan'an, Chairman of College Administration Committee, Guizhou Polytechnic of Construction; Mr. Zhu Yuhua, President and Professor, Yellow River Conservancy Technical Institute; Mr. Jumintono Suwardi, Head of Magister of Vocational Education, University of Ahmad Dahlah, Indonesia and more.

Proposed activities for cross-country collaboration between China and Southeast Asia includes language teacher exchange, student exchange, online cultural twinning classroom,

and benchmarking visit. These aim to promote the exchange of teaching pedagogies and learning resources and to develop global competitiveness. It is highly expected that the implementation between parties will be started in September 2017 onwards.

Towards the end of the workshop, VSA Pundang signed the Framework of Cooperation on Teacher and Student Exchange with the President of Guizhou Vocational College of Agriculture. This is an initial move among member countries on ASEAN Education Cooperation.
