The School takes pride in the quality of tech-voc education it offers to its immediate environs and the Mindanao region at large. The aquaculture department is its most priced steed being one of the centers of excellence in aquaculture cum processing in the country. Also, Lupon School of Fisheries is the sole assessment center for Regions XI and XII where mentors and students alike converge, from as far as the SOCSARGEN areas, to the newly created Davao Occidental province to test their knowledge and skills for a possible National Certificate (NC II) in aquaculture.

Aquaculture, being its distinctive area of competence, also has a slew of facilities and equipment dedicated to facilitate the best training to its trainees but not one without a hitch, hence the Kia Bongo double cab drop side pick-up truck.

A reliable transporter to ferry students from the main campus to the School's 4.5 hectare agri-fishery property in Barangay Ilangay is one of the compliance audit findings for the aquaculture department in 2016. The LSF management then felt the need to acquire such equipment not only to satisfy the findings but provide the students what is due them and use the vehicle for its CBTED and BUB endeavors.
