

119th Philippine Independence Day a Farce?

When President Rodrigo Roa Duterte, declared Martial Law in the southern part of Mindanao last May 23, 2017 after the attempt of the Maute, a local terrorist group, who claims to have ties with ISIS, to occupy Marawi City, has garnered strong oppositions, saying that it trample(s) on the freedom of the citizens. According to Bishop Arturo Bastes from northern Sorsogon Dioces, "As long as there is martial law and unrest in Marawi City, the 'independence' of our nation is a farce".

LSF opens new School-Year

Lupon School of Fisheries (LSF) warmly welcomes the School Year 2017 – 2018 last July 13, 2017 with 215 new and returning students from different qualifications as of the start of classes.

However, a few of students who yet to be enrol are expected with the implementation of "Request for Tendering Scholarship" wherein Training and Assessment Fees are free for some of the qualifications.

This is the second year in a row where enrolment has decreased due to the implementation of the K to 12 Program by the Department of Education. However, the LSF faculty and staff made great efforts in order to attract additional enrolees for the school year through various advocacy programs.

Star Validation Team visits LSF

Earlier in 2017, a team of experts led by PD Arlyn Bandong of Compostela Valley, Star Regional Review Committee shepherd for Davao Region, visited Lupon School of Fisheries.

To validate the result of the SRRC, the Star Validation Team from TESDA Central Office composed of five personnel, likewise, paid a visit last June 5-6, 2017.

In contrast to most Training Centers and TTIs which submitted at least one from TESDA Central Office qualification for the Star Rating System

evaluation, Lupon School of Fisheries had virtually all its qualifications evaluated and validated by the Star Validation team.

Out of the 12 qualifications evaluated, 9 did qualify for 1 star level award and 3 were eligible for an even higher level award category of 2 stars including the School's Center of Excellence.
