Lupon School of Fisheries (LSF) joined the campaign against illegal drugs by celebrating the Drug Prevention and Control Week on November 19-29, 2017.

The week-long activity commenced with a quiz bee and poster making contest and was concluded by a symposium on November 29, 2017 at LSF covered court.

With the theme “Makinig muna: Ang Pakikinig sa mga bata o kabataan ay daan upang tulungan silang lumaki na malusog at ligtas,” students listened eagerly to the talks of notable speakers. Police Inspector Bembo Aying, the Chief of Police of the Lupon Municipal Police Office talked about the role of the PNP on Drug Abuse Prevention and Control. Dra. Belen Larrobis, M.D., the Municipal

Health Officer of Rural Health Unit – Lupon was also invited to discuss about HIV/AIDS in commemoration of the World AIDS Day with the theme “Let’s end it: End isolation. End stigma.”
