This year, the National Assessment Day was held last June 26-27, 2018.

Both in-house and external competency assessors were assigned in their respective qualifications to accommodate the expected assesses.

At the end of the day there were 54 assessed and 38 of them were certified in 8 different qualifications such as Computer Systems Servicing NCII, Driving NCII, Food and Beverage Services NCII, Bread and Pastry Production NCII, Aquaculture NCII, DomRAC NCII, Bookkeeping NCIII and Massage Therapy NCII.
