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Rañeses attends Technopreneurship Training in China

Janette T. Rañeses, MVE of Lupon School of Fisheries attended the CPSC-ZJTIE (Colombo Plan Staff College – Zhejiang Technical Institute of Economics) Special International Training Program on Technopreneurship, E-Commerce and Pedagogy Concepts held on April 9 – May 12, 2018.

The Phase I of the Training Program was held in Colombo Plan Staff College, Manila, Philippines on April 19 – 21, 2018 while the Phase II was held in Zhejiang Technical Institute of Economics, Hangzhou, China on April 22 - May 12, 2018. This was attended by 21 selected trainers in Technical Vocational Education and Training (TVET) colleges and polytechnics of 16 countries namely: Philippines, Cambodia, Malaysia, Fiji,

Papua New Guinea, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Maldives, Bhutan, Sri Langka, Mongolia, Thailand, Bangladesh, Indonesia, Nepal and Myanmar.

The program aims to impart understanding of technopreneurship and ecommerce therefore helping participants design and plan to embed technopreneurship in the TVET System of their respective countries. It also seeks to develop mindset that stresses entrepreneurial teaching and learning and acquire a deep understanding on how technopreneurial ventures are able to achieve growth, improve local and global competitiveness and redirect a significant critical mass of TVET graduates from wage employment to Technopreneurial careers.

The Rise of DOPI

Lupon School of Fisheries (LSF) is now getting closer to its renaming to Davao Oriental Polytechnic Institute (DOPI) as Senate Bill Number 1767 had been approved during the Joint Public Hearing last May 29, 2018 at Sen. Recto Room, 2nd Floor, Senate of the Philippines, Pasay City.

It was Ruth R. Pundang, Vocational School Administrator III of Lupon School of Fisheries, who warded the proposed bill during the Senate hearing conducted by the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture joint with the Committees on Ways and Means, Health and Demography, and Finance.

SBN 1767 which seeks to change the name of Lupon School of Fisheries (LSF) to Davao Oriental Polytechnic Institute (DOPI) was filed by the former TESDA Secretary, Senator Emmanuel Joel Villanueva last March 21, 2018. Also, it was just last year, November 28, 2017 when renaming of LSF to DOPI

through House Bill 6724 introduced by the Honorable Representative Joel Mayo Z. Almario of the Second District of the Province of Davao Oriental was approved in the House of Representatives.

The bill mentioned that LSF is considered as one of the Centers of Excellence in Mindanao in the field of Aquaculture, a recipient of Republic of Germany's Expansion and Dual Education Training (EDET) and first in the Philippines to be awarded with Gold Level Accreditation from the Asia Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission.

LSF also started offering 3-Year Diploma Courses on Fishery Technology, Agricultural Technology, Livelihood Technology, and Hotel and Restaurant Technology with its upgraded laboratories, training facilities, equipments, human resources, and in the process of developing innovations for technology transfer and skills development.

With these milestones, the school has established a good reputation to its clients as it has become a center of technical vocational education and training in various courses identified under key employment generators (KEG) accommodating all kinds of students such as out-of-school youth, high school graduates, unemployed, degree holders, industry workers, household mothers and farmers.

Changing the school's name from Lupon School of Fisheries to Davao Oriental Polytechnic Institute is not only a denotation that LSF is now reaping what it has sown but also a rising mark of the upcoming challenges to be faced by the institution and its working team.
