The thanksgiving anniversary program on November 28, 2019 was graced by the TESDA Director General - Isidro S. Lapeña who delivered the keynote speech

and emphasized the role of TESDA in the skills training and employment of the middle-level workforce. The Director General also recognized the achievements of Davao Oriental Polytechnic Institute being the first APACC Gold Accredited and being first TESDA Training Institution in the Philippines awarded as 2018 Best TTI.

The event also features a thanksgiving anniversary program re: Pagpupugay sa Katangi-tanging Kabalikatan ng DOPI, where best in 5s and Green TVET implementers are recognized.

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DOPI 25th Graduation Rites

The 25th Commencement Exercises of Davao Oriental Polytechnic Institute (DOPI) held on December 20, 2019 at the DOPI covered court with the theme "Quality TVET Graduates towards Greater Productivity and Employability" was a day for the graduating class to take a notch higher from trainees to skilled workers ready to take the industry.
